**Circular to Dealers in Precious Metals and Stones
Anti-Money Laundering / Counter-Terrorist Financing**

**United Nations Sanctions (Democratic Republic of the Congo) Regulation 2019
(Amendment) (No. 2) Regulation 2024**

The United Nations Sanctions (Democratic Republic of the Congo) Regulation 2019 (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulation 2024 (“the DR Congo Amendment Regulation (No. 2)”), made under the United Nations Sanctions Ordinance (Cap. 537) (“UNSO”), was published in the Gazette (L.N. 119 of 2024) on 20 September 2024 with immediate effect.

The DR Congo Amendment Regulation (No. 2) amends the United Nations Sanctions (Democratic Republic of the Congo) Regulation 2019 to give effect to certain decisions relating to sanctions in the United Nations Security Council Resolution 2738 in respect of the Democratic Republic of the Congo. The amendments renew arms embargo, travel ban and financial sanctions.

Dealers in precious metals and stones are reminded to comply with the regulations made under the UNSO. Category B registrants (“CBRs”) are further reminded to refer to Chapters 6 & 7 of the “Guideline on Anti-Money Laundering and Counter-Financing of Terrorism (For Category B Registrants Dealing in Precious Metals and Stones)” which contains guidance on the appropriate measures that CBRs should take to ensure compliance with the relevant requirements.
