#### **Circular to Money Service Operators**

# Electronic Submission of Periodic Return for Statement of Transactions via Money Service Operators Licensing System

In accordance with the Money Service Operators ("MSOs") Licensing Guide, MSOs are required to submit periodic returns ("PRs") to the Commissioner of Customs and Excise ("CCE") in the form specified by the CCE in a timely manner. Any failure to submit a PR on time may result in the suspension and/or revocation of the licence. Under the existing mechanism, a PR is lodged quarterly based on the start date of the MSO licence, i.e. 4 submissions per year.

With a view to allowing sufficient time for MSO licensees to prepare accurate information and facilitating the submission process, the Customs and Excise Department ("C&ED") will adjust the lodgement arrangement for PRs with effect from 30 June 2025.

The new lodgement arrangement is on a <u>half-yearly basis</u>, i.e. 2 submissions per year, in which the first return covers the transaction information <u>from 1 January to 30 June</u> of the respective year and the second return covers those <u>from 1 July to 31 December</u>. For the purpose of staying abreast of the latest trend in the money service industry and formulating effective and appropriate regulatory measures for the money service business, the CCE also requires MSOs to provide additional information in the new PR including:

- foreign currencies involved in money changing transactions;
- jurisdictions involved in remittance transactions; and
- delivery channels used in remittance transactions.

An **Annex** is appended for illustrating the data required in the new PR.

With the new lodgement arrangement in place, <u>all MSO licensees</u> are required to lodge their first new PR, covering the transactions from 1 January 2025 to 30 June 2025, beginning from 1 July 2025.

In addition, to further promote electronic services for various applications and submissions in relation to MSO licences, MSO licensees are required to submit new PRs via the electronic service of the Money Service Operators Licensing System ("MSOS"). The C&ED will no longer accept PR submission in paper form. In this connection, MSO licensees are reminded to create a user account on MSOS in advance. 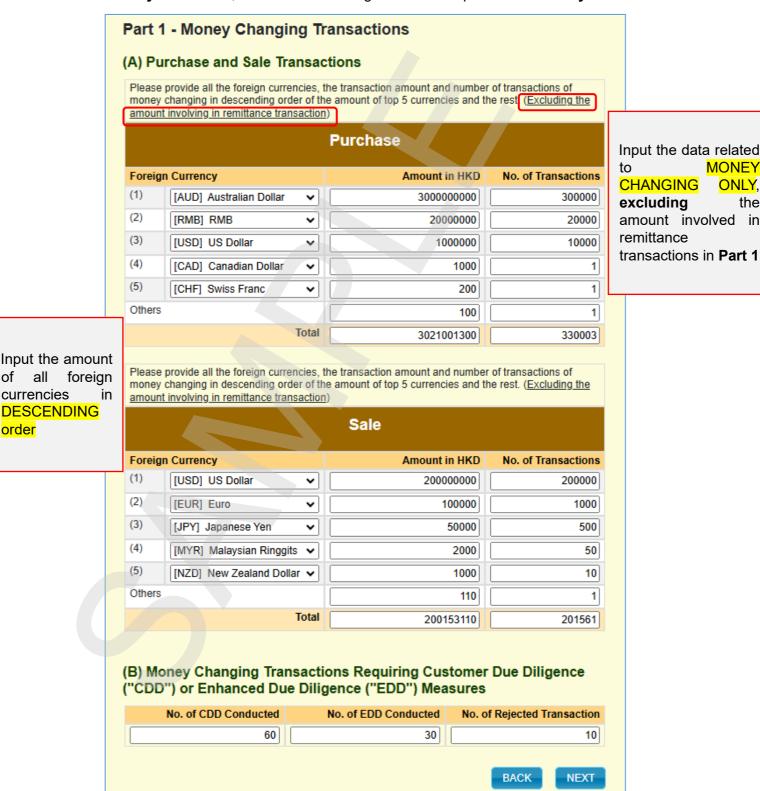

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#### Key Points of Submitting Data in the Revamped Periodic Return

- Ensure that you have an account on the Money Service Operators Licensing System ("MSOS").
- Lodge periodic returns on the MSOS twice a year, i.e. the first lodgement of each year for the period from 1 January to 30 June; and the second lodgement for the period from 1 July to 31 December.
